- Expenditure, \$41k decrease of \$2300, mainly due to trans-tasman cost held in Sydney last season. High uniform costs with the change in rebranding, higher competition costs and

additional coaching resources as well as restocking of equipment and increased costs in website hosting fees.

- Overall deficit \$2619 compared to last year.
- Although numbers are down the club is in a good financial position.
